



Performing a Shakedown before your **Backpacking Trip** "Every ounce matters"

Churches do not have the capacity to continue every pre-COVID ministry Make "every ounce matter" as you relaunch

and evaluate ministries

Assess every ministry before relaunch

- Purpose: every ministry relaunched should clearly fulfill the mission and vision of the congregation
- Impact: transforming lives, connecting people to Christ
- Relationships: creating opportunities for members to be engaged to show up, build relationships with each other, and experience meaningful ministry

- Move beyond worship with a camera in the back of the sanctuary
- Create shareable digital opportunities for human connection and storytelling

• Mix lay, staff and clergy voices
